


# SET 01

In a multinational organization eight designations are available viz.Director, CEO, CFO, AGM, Manager, Assistant Manager (AM), Clerk,
and Stenographer. Seven persons – P, Q, R, S, T, U, and V are
designated on each post. Only one person is designated on each
post. One post is vacant but neither the Director nor the
Stenographer post is vacant. Each person belongs to different cities
viz.- Pune, Chennai, Delhi, Patna, Varanasi, Jaipur, and Mangalore.
All the information is not necessary in the same order.

Note: Designation is in descending order such that Director is the highest designated person whereas stenographer is the lowest designated person. Any person can be terminated by his higher designated person but not immediately higher.

R is designated as an Assistant Manager. Two persons are designated between R and the one who belongs to Pune. The one who belongs to Jaipur is designated three persons junior to P. P is neither designated as CFO nor Manager. The one who belongs to Varanasi terminates P. Two persons are designated between S and T, who belong to Chennai and is not designated as Clerk. The one who belongs to Chennai is neither designated as Manager nor CFO. The one who belongs to Patna terminates V. Neither P nor U belongs to Patna. Neither Q nor the one who belongs to Mangalore is designated as CFO. U neither belongs Varanasi nor designated as CFO. R doesn't belong to Mangalore.











# **SET 02**

A certain number of persons are living in a building containing two flats viz. Flat A and Flat B with a certain number of floors. Flat A is to the west of Flat B. The lowermost floor is numbered as 1 and the floor immediately above it is numbered as 2 and so on. Flat A of floor 2 is immediately above flat A of floor 1 whereas flat B of floor 2 is immediately above the flat B of floor 1 and so on.

P lives three floors above A. Only one floor is between M and A. V lives immediately below P in the same flat and lives north-west flat of M. The number of floors between M and the floor which is immediately below P is the same as the number of floors between P and I. I do not live on the adjacent floor of A. I live in the same flat as A. S lives exactly in the middle of the floors of P and I and lives south-east of J. J lives immediately above I. The number of floors above T is the same as below M. Not more than four floors are there below A. Z lives on the adjacent floor of J, both are living in a different flat. The number of floors between I and S is the same as the number of floors between Z and T who lives in the same flat as J. L lives two floors above and north of T who lives north of J. The number of floors above L is the same as below H who lives south-west of M. The number of floors between H and A is the same as between S and Z. H and A live in different flats.











# SET 03

Nine persons namely – Shan, Mongali, Rahul, Kabir, Monty, Popat, Bunty, Shreya, and Madhu were born in three different years viz.-1999, 1996, and 1993. Each of them was born in three different months viz.- January, April, and August. Each of them also likes different books viz.- Harry Potter, Fairy Tales, Secret Garden, Champak, Panchtantra, Ruskin Bond, Jungle Book, Wings of Fire, and Meluha. All the information is not necessarily in the same order. The one who likes Jungle book was born in a leap year in the month having 30 days. Only two persons were born between the one who likes Jungle book and Mongali, who likes Secret Garden. The one who likes Ruskin bond was born in August but neither in the same year as the one who likes Jungle book nor in the same year as Mongali. Shan was born in one of the months having 31 days and was born three years before Madhu, who likes Ruskin bond. No person was born between Shan and the one who likes Panchtantra. As many persons born before Monty as after the one who likes Panchtantra. Monty was born in the same year as neither Madhu nor Shreya, who likes Harry potter. Only two persons were born between Shreya and Bunty, who likes neither Panchtantra nor Jungle Book. The one who likes Meluha was either born in a leap year or was born in April. Only two persons were born between Rahul and the one who likes Meluha, who was born in the same year as Popat. Kabir

was born two persons after the one who likes Champak. The one who likes Wings of Fire was not born in January.

# **SET 04**

Ten persons P, Q, R, S, T, U, V, W, X and Y sit in two parallel rows i.e., Row I and Row II but not necessarily in the same order. Row I is in south of Row II. Persons, who sit in row I, face towards north direction and persons, who sit in row II, face towards south direction. There are six seats in each row out of which one seat is vacant in each row. All the seats of Row I are opposite to the seats of Row II. The distance between each of the adjacent seats in the given rows is same. Each of these persons have different number of chocolates from 1 to 10.

Note: I. Vacant seats are neither at the extreme ends of the rows nor opposite to each other.

II. If it is given that no one/one/two persons sit to the left/right of a person, then it means there is no vacant seat to the left/right of that person.

III. If a person sits immediate left of P, then there may or may not be vacant seat between them.

One person sits to the right of V, who has perfect square number of chocolates. Q has just less chocolates than V. V's seat is 3rd to the right of Q's seat. The one, who has just less chocolates than W, sits to the left of Q. X sits opposite to V. X's seat is immediate left of S's seat. S has the least number of chocolates.









There are only two seats between W's seat and T's seat. T faces same direction as Q. W sits adjacent to one of the vacant seats. W sits opposite to U, who has thrice the chocolates as X. Sum of the chocolates of P and the one, who sits opposite to P, is 16. R and Y sit neither in the same row nor opposite to each other. P doesn't sit opposite to T. W has less chocolates than T. Sum of the chocolates with the persons, who sit in row I is more than that of row II.

# 1) Answer: A

The best approach here is working backwards from the options!

- (b)  $\rightarrow$  If we suppose that energy efficient automobiles are not available in the market, what is the use of giving subsidies, prices etc for something that does not even exist? So, (b) is ruled out
- (c)  $\rightarrow$  Even if we suppose that the government wants to replace the cars, it will be a part of a bigger aim under which it will be done. Also, the paragraph talks about sale of buses so this eliminates (c) as well
- (d)  $\rightarrow$  Can't make a direct relation with what is being talked about so eliminated
- (a)  $\rightarrow$  When we suppose that the government is willing to promote energy-efficiency and cut pollution, we can easily relate the steps being given in the paragraph as a part of the government's execution plan. So, this stands to be the best assumption.

# 2) Answer: A

Option (b) puts forth additional information, which may or may not be true. This renders it unsound as an assumption behind the passage.

Option (c) again, though carries possibly relevant information, cannot be safely selected as an assumption. Option (d) would be far fetched vis-à-vis option (a) which gives the clear assumption behind the passage. Thus option (a) is the answer.











# 3) Answer: E

Answer choice (E): This is the correct answer. The answer can be difficult because it is somewhat similar to answer choice (B), which many people already eliminated by the time they reached this answer. Answer (E) is different from answer (B) because it involves learning details from a third source. This is important because the conclusion references the independent discovery of calculus, and so the author must believe that neither Newton nor Leibniz learned anything substantial about calculus from other sources. This elimination of an idea that weakens the argument is the essence of a Defender answer choice. To further confirm the answer, consider the negation of this answer choice ("neither...nor" becomes "either...or"): "Either Newton or Leibniz learned crucial details about calculus from somethird source." This negated answer undermines the assertion that Leibniz and Newton each independently discovered calculus.

Consequently, this is the correct answer

# 4) Answer: D

a, b and c do not address the statement and do not weaken it. D weakens it.

# 5) Answer: C
