- In 2022, the RBI allowed foreign banks to open Special Vostro Rupee Accounts (SVRAs) to promote rupee-based trade settlements, as part of a broader push to internationalise the Indian rupee.
- The existing rule capped the use of vostro balances for buying securities with less than one year maturity to 30%, which the RBI now wants to lift to enhance rupee trade flows.
- As of December 2024, 156 SRVAs were being opened with 26 Indian banks by 123 correspondent banks from 30 other nations.
- All vostro accounts, including SRVAs, had a total balance of 134.55 billion rupees, or around \$1.60 billion.

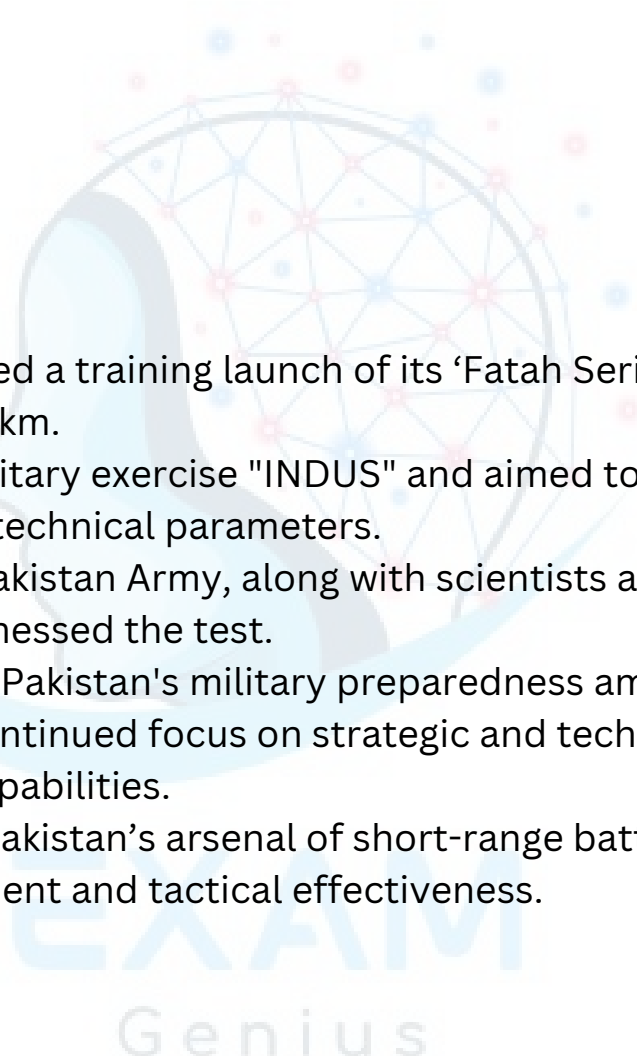

- Ghaziabad is the first Indian city to issue a Certified Green Municipal Bond, raising Rs.150 crore to fund a Tertiary Sewage Treatment Plant (TSTP)
- Sayani Das became the first Indian woman to conquer the North Channel, completing the 38 km swim between Northern Ireland and Scotland in 13 hours and 22 minutes
- China has launched its first-ever Gold Recycling ATM at the Global Harbor Shopping Mall, Shanghai
- AIIMS Raipur successfully performed its first Swap Kidney Transplant (Kidney Paired Donation). With this, it became the first among the newer AIIMS institutes and the first government hospital in Chhattisgarh to achieve this milestone
- India's smartphone exports crossed the Rs.2 lakh crore milestone for the first time in FY2024–25, as announced by Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw
- China achieved a major technological milestone with the launch of the world's first 10G broadband network in Sunan County, Hebei Province on April 20, 2025
- On the Chennai Beach–Chengalpattu route, South India's first AC EMU (Electric Multiple Unit) train was introduced, providing Metro-like comfort and signaling a significant development in the suburban rail system of the area
- Amaravati, the proposed capital city of Andhra Pradesh, is set to become the world's first city powered entirely by renewable energy
- An important step toward environmentally friendly and sustainable mining methods will be taken when South Eastern Coalfields Limited (SECL) becomes the first coal PSU in India to use paste fill technology for coal mining
- The construction of a 3D-printed train station in Arida City by the West Japan Railway Company is a first for the globe and represents a major advancement in rail infrastructure innovation

Shri Gyaneshwar Kumar Singh has assumed charge as the new Director General and Chief Executive Officer of the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (IICA)

Ministry of Home Affairs constituted a High- Level Committee under the chairmanship of Union Minister Amit Shah to oversee national disaster preparedness and response mechanisms.
