- This action was taken under Section 44A(4) read with Section 56 of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.
- Following the merger, all branches of Sawantwadi Urban Co-operative Bank will operate as TJSB Sahakari Bank branches from the effective date.

- Virat Kohli, the former Indian captain, retired from Test cricket in January 2025, just before the England tour.
- His final Test appearance was during the 2024–25 Border-Gavaskar Trophy in Sydney against Australia.
- He debuted in 2011 against the West Indies at Jamaica.
- He averaged 46.85 and amassed 9230 runs in 123 Test matches. In 2019, he reached his highest score of 254 not out in a match against South Africa in Pune.
- He is fourth on the list with 30 Test hundreds, only after Rahul Dravid (36), Sunil Gavaskar (34), and Sachin Tendulkar (51 hundreds).
- The most centuries scored by an Indian captain was twenty, which Kolhi achieved while serving as captain.
- Virat Kohli took over the Indian team captaincy from Mahendra Singh Dhoni in 2014.
- Kohli is the fourth most successful Test captain in the world after South African Graeme Smith (53), Australian Ricky Ponting (48), and Steve Waugh (41).

- La Prensa was honoured for its courageous journalism amid ongoing government repression in Nicaragua.




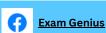

- The Sample Registration System (SRS) 2021 report, released by the Registrar General of India (RGI), highlights that Bihar recorded the highest Total Fertility Rate (TFR) in India at 3.0.
- In contrast, Delhi and West Bengal reported the lowest TFR at 1.4.
- The national average TFR is 2.0, which is below the replacement level of 2.1, indicating population stabilization at the national level.
- Urban TFR stands at 1.6, while rural TFR is 2.2, reflecting higher fertility in rural regions.
- The demographic shift includes a growing elderly population and declining youth share, with key states like Tamil Nadu (14.4%) and Himachal Pradesh (12.3%) having high elderly percentages.
- As per the SRS 2021 Report by the Registrar General of India, India's Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) declined to 93 per 1 lakh live births for the period 2019-21, a 37-point improvement from 130 in 2014–16.
- The Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) dropped from 39 in 2014 to 27 per 1000 live births in 2021.
- Neonatal Mortality Rate (NMR) declined from 26 to 19, and Under-Five Mortality Rate (U5MR) fell from 45 to 31 per 1000 live births during the same period.

- The TA was formally inaugurated on 9 October 1949 by C. Rajagopalachari, and this day is celebrated as Territorial Army Day.

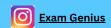




## About Phase 1 of the Ballistic Missile Defence System:

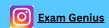
- Missiles within a range of less than 2000 kilometers can be intercepted by the DRDO's Phase 1 BMD.
- The Chinese missiles Dongfeng-21 and Pakistani missiles Shaheen and Ghauri can both be intercepted by the Phase-1.
- There are now hypersonic missile interceptors that can reach speeds of Mach 4-5.

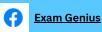
















About Phase 2 of the Ballistic Missile Defence System:

- It is being designed to intercept intercontinental ballistic missiles with a range of more than 5,000 kilometers.
- Hypersonic interceptor missiles with a Mach 6-7 speed will also be produced



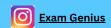
- Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai laid the foundation stone for India's first Artificial Intelligence based Data Centre Park in Nava Raipur, Chhattisgarh. The first phase will commence with a capacity of 5 MegaWatts with plans to expand up to 150 MW
- In Tripura, Rangacherra village has earned the distinction of becoming the first green village in the state due to the efforts of the state government.
- The Andhra Pradesh Government and CreativeLand Asia (CLA) Limited have partnered to develop 'Creatorland', India's first Transmedia Entertainment City, in Amaravati
- India's first interstate cheetah conservation corridor is being developed jointly by Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh, covering a total area of 17,000 square kilometers
