- The new National Park status is expected to give a major boost to eco-tourism, wildlife protection, and forest conservation efforts in eastern India.




- The DP World India Championship 2025 will debut at the historic Delhi Golf Club, on the Lodhi Course, from October 16 to 19, 2025.
