- Unified Lending Interface (ULI) is an API-based, consent-driven digital platform developed by the Reserve Bank Innovation Hub (RBIH) in collaboration with the RBI to enhance India's digital credit infrastructure.
- It enables secure access to borrower data like Aadhaar, land records, tax filings, and KYC from various sources by banks and financial institutions.
- ULI is a form of Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) that aggregates data from key sources such as GSTN, milk pouring data, satellite data, and verification services like Aadhaar e-KYC and PAN.
- It also integrates with Account Aggregators and Digilocker, and provides property data analytics to support faster and more accurate loan underwriting.
- The platform was first announced by former RBI Governor Shri Shaktikanta Das at the RBI 90@ Global Conference on August 26, 2024.

- RBI has extended call money market hours by 2 hours, now operating from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM
- RBI has scheduled a 7-day Variable Rate Reverse Repo (VRRR) auction of Rs.1 lakh crore on June 27, 2025 to absorb surplus liquidity in the banking system
- To address the rising issue of digital payment frauds, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is collaborating with major public and private sector banks to build a new platform named DPIP (Digital Payment Intelligence Platform)
- RBI has revised the priority sector lending (PSL) norms for Small Finance Banks (SFBs) effective from FY 2025–26
- RBI has eased project funding norms, especially for under-construction loans, to support infrastructure financing and reduce liquidity stress on banks
- RBI has amended the Master Direction – Import of Goods and Services, originally issued on January 1, 2016

- On June 16, 2025, RBI Deputy Governor T. Rabi Sankar inaugurated the new Regional Office of the Reserve Bank of India in Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh
- Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI), in collaboration with RBI and banks, launched a pilot project to digitise legacy user consents
- RBI has issued draft guidelines for Rupee Interest Rate Derivatives (IRD) to keep the regulatory framework in line with evolving market dynamics
- RBI plans to re-issue sovereign green bonds (SGrBs) during the upcoming government securities (G-Secs) auction on June 13, 2025

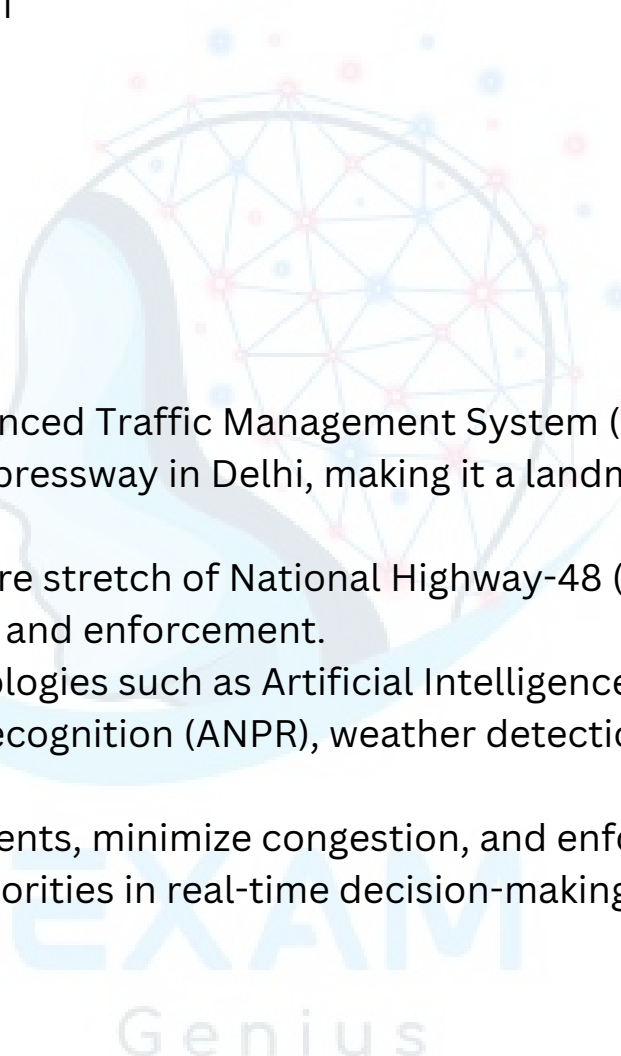

- India's first AI-based Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS) has been launched on the Dwarka Expressway in Delhi, making it a landmark initiative in smart traffic control.
- It also covers a 28-kilometre stretch of National Highway-48 (NH-48), enhancing real-time traffic monitoring and enforcement.
- The system utilizes technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), smart cameras, Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR), weather detection, and incident alerting.
- The aim is to reduce accidents, minimize congestion, and enforce better road discipline, while aiding authorities in real-time decision-making and automated rule enforcement

- The Shaktipeeth Expressway is a major infrastructure project approved by the Maharashtra Cabinet on June 24, 2025.
- It will span 802 km, connecting 12 districts from Pavnar in Wardha to Patradevi on the Maharashtra-Goa border.
- The expressway is designed to reduce travel time between Nagpur and Goa from 18 hours to 8 hours.
- It will link 18 religious shrines, enhancing religious tourism by connecting key Shakti Peethas across Maharashtra and Goa.
- The project is being implemented by the Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation (MSRDC).
- A major loan of Rs.12,000 crore will be sourced from HUDCO for land acquisition, while the total project cost is estimated at over Rs.84,000 crore.
- The expressway is modeled after the Nagpur-Mumbai Samruddhi Mahamarg, an access-controlled highway.
- Despite its benefits, the project is facing strong opposition from farmers along the proposed corridor.

- DAY-NRLM, launched in June 2011, aims to reduce rural poverty by promoting livelihood opportunities, enhancing skill development, and improving access to financial services for rural households.
- With an annual budget of over Rs.13,000 crore, the scheme covers 7.15 lakh villages across 723 districts, and reaches over 8.6 crore rural households.

- It focuses on the MPOWER measures, which are proven strategies under the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) to reduce tobacco use.

MPOWER stands for:

- M – Monitor tobacco use and prevention policies
- P – Protect people from tobacco smoke
- O – Offer help to quit tobacco
- W – Warn about dangers of tobacco
- E – Enforce bans on tobacco advertising
- R – Raise taxes on tobacco products

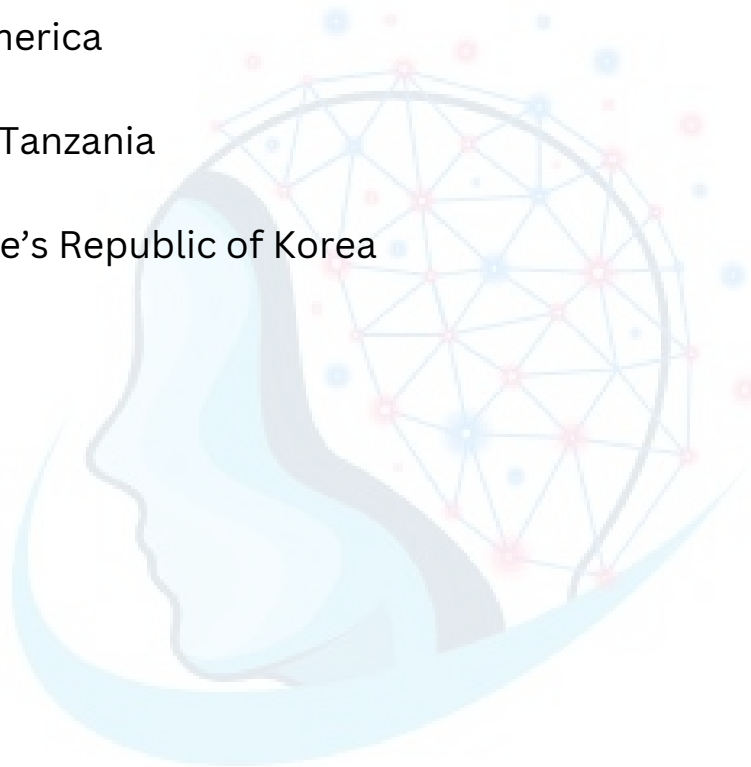
- The 2025 report especially emphasizes the ‘W’ measure (warn about dangers) and shows that 6.1 billion people are now protected by at least one MPOWER measure.
- India is recognized for best-practice-level graphic health warnings and has been in the top group for the ‘W’ measure since 2016
- However, tobacco taxation (‘R’ measure) is the least adopted MPOWER strategy in India.
- India leads globally by applying tobacco control regulations to digital streaming content, in addition to traditional media.

- This enhances the ICG's capability in law enforcement, coastal surveillance, rescue operations, and EEZ protection.
- 'Adamya' has been completely designed and built by GSL, showcasing India's progress in shipbuilding and promoting the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative.

- Russia has trademarked technology for launching autonomous spacecraft from orbital stations. This will be the world's first drone platform with self-maintenance robotic systems
- Rudrastra is an indigenously developed VTOL (Vertical Take-Off and Landing) drone tested by the Indian Army for precision strikes
- 'Achal' is the 5th Fast Patrol Vessel (FPV) in a series of 8 being constructed by Goa Shipyard Ltd. (GSL) for the Indian Coast Guard
- The Indian Air Force (IAF) is set to acquire I-STAR aircraft under a Rs.10,000 crore project, which is expected to be cleared soon by the government
- INS Arnala is the first Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC) of the Indian Navy. It will be commissioned on 18 June 2025 at the Naval Dockyard in Visakhapatnam, presided over by General Anil Chauhan, Chief of Defence Staff
- MSC Irina is the world's largest container ship, with a carrying capacity of 24,346 TEUs (Twenty-foot Equivalent Units).
- The MV Wan Hai 503, a Singapore-flagged container vessel, caught fire 88 nautical miles off the Beypore coast in Kerala
