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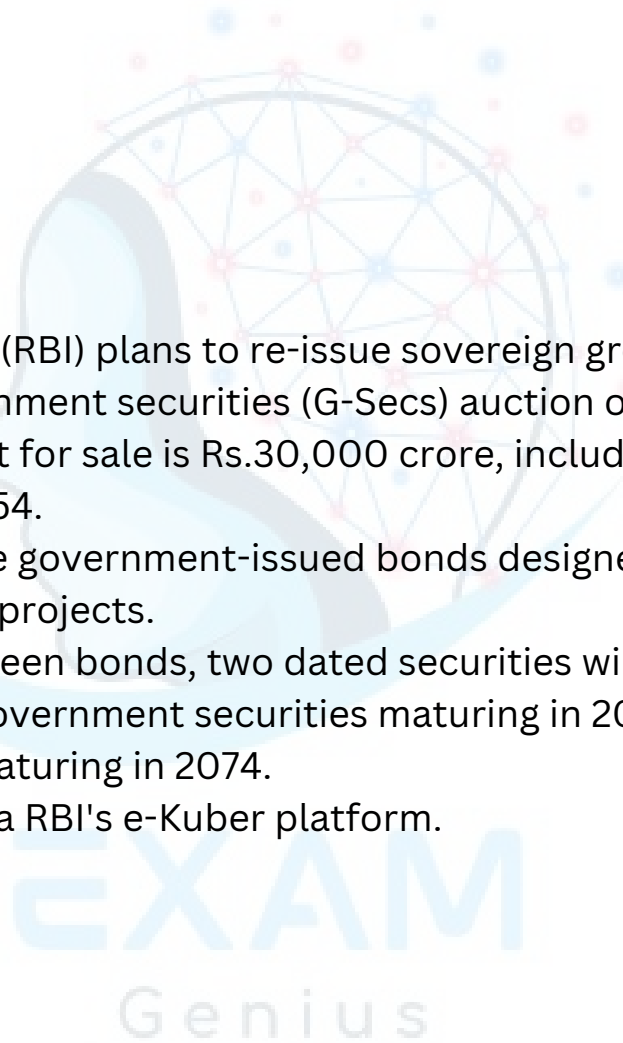

- The deities are brought from the Ratna Sinhasana (main sanctum) to the Snana Mandap (bathing altar).
- The ritual is believed to have been first instituted by King Indradyumna, the legendary founder of the Puri temple.
- After the ceremonial bath, the deities are believed to fall ill and go into a 15-day quarantine period called Anasara, which lasts from Jyestha Purnima to Ashadha Amavasya, during which they are kept away from public view.
