- Among them, Indian Bank collected the highest penalty, amounting to Rs.1,828 crore.


Other major contributors were:

- Punjab National Bank Rs.1,662 crore
- Bank of Baroda Rs.1,532 crore
- Canara Bank Rs.1,213 crore
- State Bank of India (SBI) stopped collecting minimum balance penalties in March 2020.
- The Department of Financial Services (DFS) has advised banks to rationalize these charges, especially for rural and semi-urban customers.
- RBI permits such charges if they follow a board-approved policy that ensures transparency and customer service.

- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has revised India's GDP growth forecast to 6.4% for FY2025-26 and 6.4% for FY2026-27, reflecting a 20 basis point hike for FY26 and a 10 basis point hike for FY27.
- The revision is attributed to stronger-than-expected investment and a resilient domestic economy, despite global uncertainties and US tariff tensions.
- This forecast is slightly below RBI's projection of 6.5% but within the Economic Survey range of 6.3%-6.8%.
- In contrast, ADB and India Ratings (Ind-Ra) lowered their FY26 forecast to 6.2%, citing global slowdown risks and policy uncertainties.
- Globally, the IMF expects growth of 3.0% in 2025 and 3.1% in 2026, slightly higher due to anticipated front-loading before potential US tariff hikes.




- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) extended the tenure of IndusInd Bank's executive committee by one month, making it valid till 28 August 2025 or until a new MD & CEO is appointed—whichever comes earlier.
- Cross-border payments fintech Xflow received in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to operate as an online payment aggregator for crossborder (PA-CB) transactions.
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) officially withdrew the Corrective Action Plan (CAP) imposed on Religare Finvest Limited (RFL), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Religare Enterprises Limited (REL)
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) cancelled the license of The Karwar Urban Cooperative Bank Ltd., Karwar, effective from July 23, 2025
- RBI has set the Financial Inclusion Index (FI-Index) at 67.0 for March 2025, which is an improvement from 64.2 in March 2024
- RBI Permits Currant Sea Investments B.V to Acquire 9.99% Stake in Infrastructure Development Finance Company (IDFC) First Bank at a Cost of Rs.4876 crores
- RBI included NSDL Payments Bank Limited in the Second Schedule of the RBI Act, 1934 through a notification dated June 19, 2025
- EximPe has received in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to operate as a Payment Aggregator for Cross-Border (PA-CB) transactions
- RBI has amended the Basel III Capital Regulations to expand credit rating options for Scheduled Commercial Banks (excluding Local Area Banks, Payments Banks, and Regional Rural Banks)
- RBI has issued draft guidelines for the closure of shipping bills in the Export Data Processing and Monitoring System (EDPMS)
- According to RBI guidelines, a Jan Dhan account is marked as "inoperative" if no customer-initiated transaction occurs for 24 consecutive months
- TZF Logistics Solutions, a subsidiary of logistics-tech firm BlackBuck, has received the Prepaid Payment Instrument (PPI) licence from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI)
- RBI has disclosed that Rs.2000 denomination banknotes valued at Rs.6,099 crore are still in circulation, despite being withdrawn from active use on May 19, 2023.



- The rise was primarily driven by improvements in payment infrastructure (supplyside) and payment performance across the country.



- Launched: January 1, 2021 with March 2018 as base
- Parameters: 1. Payment Enablers (25% weight) 2. Payment Infrastructure -Demand-side factors (10%) 3. Payment Infrastructure – Supply-side factors (15%) 4. Payment Performance (45%) 5. Consumer Centricity (5%)
- Frequency: Twice a year, for March and September, with a four-month lag

- Under the proposed Eligibility Criteria for Business Authorisation (ECBA) norms by the RBI, only Tier 3 or Tier 4 Urban Co-operative Banks (UCBs) with:
- Assessed Net Worth (ANW) of at least Rs.50 crore, and
- Full compliance with ECBA, are allowed to expand operations beyond their home state, with prior RBI approval.
- Additionally, such UCBs can expand into a maximum of 2 new states per year, provided they have capital to open at least 5 branches per state.





















Recent records in Cricket:


- Joe Root of England: has become the first batter in Test history to score 3,000 runs against India in red-ball cricket
- Rishabh Pant: created history at Headingley in the first Test against England by becoming only the second wicketkeeper in Test cricket history to score centuries in both innings of a match
- Jasprit Bumrah: became the first Asian bowler to claim 150 Test wickets in SENA countries (South Africa, England, New Zealand, and Australia).
- Jos Buttler: surpassed Ireland's Paul Stirling to become the fourth-highest runscorer in T20 Internationals, with 3678 runs
- Virat Kohli: playing for Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB), became the first cricketer to score 9000 T20 runs for a single franchise
- Joe Root: fastest cricketer to reach 13,000 Test runs in terms of matches played during a four-day Test against Zimbabwe at Trent Bridge, Nottingham
- Rohit Sharma: After Virat Kohli, he was the only other Indian hitter to reach the milestone of 12,000 T20 runs
- Virat Kohli: 100th T20 half-century while playing for Royal Challengers Bengaluru against Rajasthan Royals at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium
- M.S. Dhoni: first player in IPL history to record 200 fielding dismissals



- Gyan Bharatam Mission (GBM) is a major initiative launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi aimed at the digitisation, documentation, and conservation of over one crore (10 million) ancient manuscripts across India.
- It involves the surveying, cataloguing, and digital preservation of manuscripts currently held by libraries, museums, academic institutions, and private collectors.
- The mission is a restructured version of the National Mission for Manuscripts (NMM), which was originally set up in 2003 under the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA) during the 10th Five-Year Plan.
- Under the Union Budget 2025–26, the GBM has been launched as a Central Sector Scheme for the period 2024-31, with a total allocation of ₹482.85 crore.
- The Government of India increased the annual allocation for manuscripts conservation from Rs.3.5 crore to Rs.60 crore.
- A National Digital Repository will be created to provide global access to this rich manuscript heritage for students and scholars worldwide.



- India contributes approximately 2.5% to P&G's global revenue.





- The DTIS provides up to 75% government funding as Grant-in-Aid, while the remaining 25% is contributed by a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) consisting of Indian private entities and State/Central Governments.
- Micro Labs is the lead SPV member for this facility. Other members include Tamilnadu Industrial Development Corporation Limited (TIDCO), Bharat Earth Movers Limited (BEML), Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) and Vaidheswaran **Industries**
- The DTIS, with a total outlay of Rs.400 crore, was launched by Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh to promote collaboration between the private sector and government in building high-end defence testing infrastructure.














- Riley Powell spoiled Pankaj Advani's bid for a 29th world title, delivering a stunning comeback victory at the IBSF World 6-Red Snooker Championship.
- Indian shuttlers Tanvi Sharma and Vennala Kalagotla assured the country of two medals after storming into the singles semifinals at the Badminton Asia Junior Individual Championships 2025.
- India showcased outstanding performance at the 36th International Biology Olympiad and secured two gold and two silver medals. The event was held in Quezon City, Philippines, from July 20 to July 27
- Joe Root has now scored 13,380 runs in Test cricket, surpassing Ricky Ponting's total of 13,378 runs, making him the second-highest run-scorer in Test history





- The deadline for this installation has been extended by 2 years, now set for March 2028.
- As of now, 20.33 crore meters have been sanctioned and 2.44 crore installed.
- The total outlay of RDSS is Rs.3.03 lakh crore, with Rs.97,631 crore as budgetary support from the Central Government.
- Delays in installation have been due to new technology, tendering issues, and setup of direct debit systems.
- In February 2025, around 80,000 meters were being installed daily, with expectations to reach 1 lakh/day soon.







- The cell will manage professional and logistical requirements for hosting the 33rd Conference of the Parties (COP-33) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), proposed to be held in India in 2028.
- If approved, COP-33 will be India's second time hosting a UN Climate Conference after COP-8 in 2002 (New Delhi).
- The COP-33 Cell comprises 11 members, including directors, consultants, and support staff.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi proposed India's bid to host COP-33 during his address at COP-28 in Dubai, UAE.


- The first direct unlocking system has been installed at Dinanagar railway station in Northern Railway's Jammu division, a step that is expected to improve efficiency and safety in railway operations.
- Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw announced the successful test of India's first hydrogen-powered coach, called the Driving Power Car, at the Integral Coach Factory (ICF), Chennai
- In 2022, Madhya Pradesh became the first Indian state to introduce MBBS education in Hindi, marking a significant step toward making medical education more accessible to Hindi-medium students.





- The survey covered 1,307.49 sq km using 293 camera traps over 103 days, capturing 4,011 tiger images.
- The inclusion of the Biswanath Wildlife Division contributed to this rise, adding 27 new tigers.
- The identified tiger population included 83 males, 55 females, and 10 of undetermined gender.
- Despite this conservation success, Kaziranga faces threats from habitat degradation, human-wildlife conflict, and climate change.







- The objective is to manage pension sanction and disbursement for Armed Forces including the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Defence Civilians.
- It is administered by the Defence Accounts Department through the Principal Controller of Defence Accounts (Pensions), Prayagraj.
- It is a centralized, web-based system that directly handles pension claims and deposits pension payments into pensioners' bank accounts without any third-party intermediary.
- SPARSH also allows digital identification, self-verification, and rectification of data, aiming to minimize the need for physical visits to pension offices.
- Despite its digital approach, many ex-servicemen have reported difficulties, including interface inaccessibility and persistent data correction issues.

- It was formally constituted by the Ministry of Home Affairs under Section 8A(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005. Earlier, it operated without formal statutory backing.
- The committee is headed by the Cabinet Secretary. Other key members include the Union Home Secretary, Defence Secretary, Secretary (Coordination), and senior officials from the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA).
- The chairperson can co-opt experts or officers from central/state agencies based on the type of crisis.
- Its primary functions include Assessing disaster preparedness, Issuing directives for improvement, and Coordinating and monitoring disaster response efforts across central and state governments, NDMA, and other relevant agencies.
