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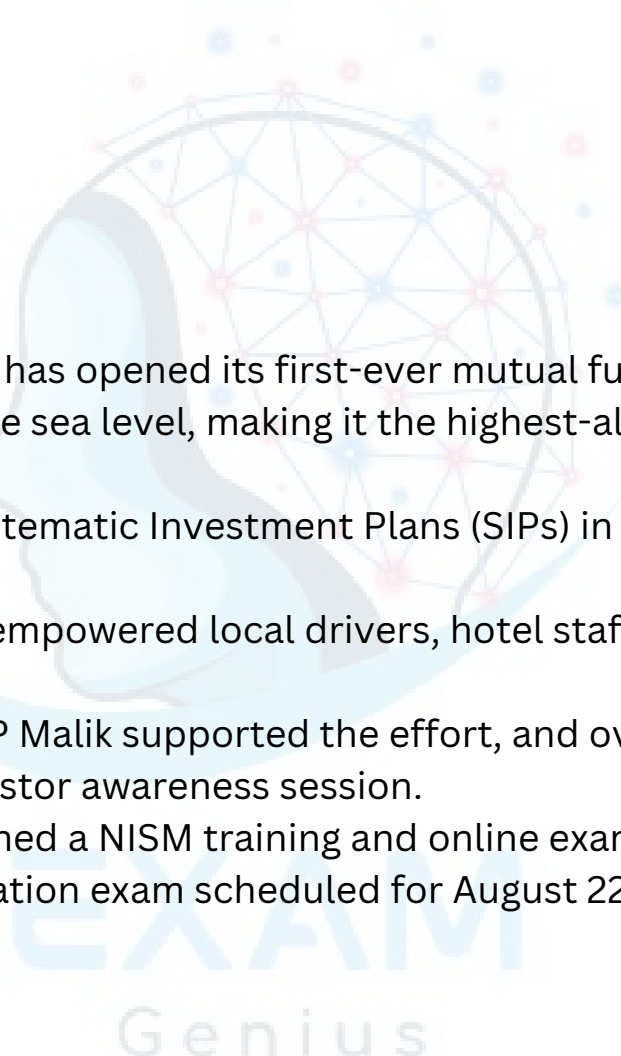

- Additionally, the "view linked accounts" feature is limited to 25 views per day per app, and failed/pending transaction status checks are restricted to 3 times a day, with at least 90 seconds between attempts.
- From August 1, a nominal fee will be levied on payment aggregators (e.g. GPay, PhonePe), though users and merchants will not be affected financially.
- UPI IDs not used for 12 months or longer may be automatically deactivated to curb misuse—particularly arising from reused mobile numbers.
- When making payments, the recipient's registered bank name and identity must now be displayed before Confirmation—enhancing user clarity and fraud prevention.
- Scheduled UPI payments (e.g. subscriptions, EMI's, utility bills) will now only execute during these non-peak windows Before 10:00 AM, Between 1:00 PM and 5:00 PM and After 9:30 PM
- The system allows up to 4 attempts per mandate (1 initial + 3 retries). Failed executions will result in cancellation and user notification.

- India had signed a \$2.5 billion deal with Airbus for 56 aircraft, of which 40 will be manufactured in India by Tata Advanced Systems, making it the first “Make in India” project in the defence aircraft sector.
- The first C295 was officially handed over to India on September 13, 2023, in Seville, in the presence of IAF Chief Air Chief Marshal V.R. Chaudhari.

India's C-295 Procurement Deal :

- In September 2021, India and Airbus inked an agreement for the purchase of 56 C-295 aircraft for the Indian Air Force (IAF).
 - The entire cost came to Rs.21,935 crore, or almost \$2.5 billion.
 - The first sixteen planes were supposed to arrive from Spain in flyaway condition.
 - Under the Make in India program, Tata Advanced Systems Limited (TASL) would manufacture the remaining 40 aircraft in India.
 - The remaining 40 C-295s will be produced domestically by Tata-Airbus in Vadodara, Gujarat.
- Assembly Line (FAL) in the private sector.

- Group A & B employees – Require approval from the Secretary of the Personnel Department.
